The Center is located off McDowell Road between 82nd Street and Granite Reef Road. You cannot see it from McDowell Road. Don't confuse it with McDowell Village, a condominium complex on McDowell. You can't get to the Senior Center from McDowell Village. You must enter from Granite Reef.

It can be approached from 82nd street or Granite Reef Road. The second option is the easiest one.

To reach the Senior Center from the north:

From Scottsdale Road, go south as if you're going to the old Senior Center but continue south about 3 miles to McDowell. Make a left on McDowell and go 2-3 miles to Granite Reef, then make a left. There is a gas station on the left, and the Center is the next building after that. It is a low, modern glass building. There is lots of parking.

From the 101, take McDowell exit. Make a right going west. In about a mile you will get to Granite Reef Road; make a right and the Center will be on your left side.

From the south:

Going north on Scottsdale Road, make a right on McDowell. Get into the left lane, go to Granite Reef Road, make a left, and the Center is just past the gas station.

From the 101: get off at the McDowell exit, make a left on McDowell. After about a mile you will come to Granite Reef Road. Make a right and the Center will be on your left after the gas station.

Last month at the ASA.....

Robert Corre

Friday lecture: On the Fundamentals of Horoscope Interpretation

Mr. Corre teaches the disciplines of the J. B. Morin de Villefranche method of astrological chart interpretation as taught to him by Zoltan S. Mason of New York City. Mr. Corre left his position at New York University in 1995 to become a professional astrologer.

Structure and discipline are required to interpret a horoscope successfully, and Morin's method teaches a systematic approach. With 12 signs, 12 houses, and 10 planets in every chart, what makes the difference between individual human beings? It is the intricate mixture of influences.

Mr. Corre stated that forecasting techniques have nothing to do with predictions. **What** to expect comes from the natal chart. **When** to expect it can be determined from the predictive technique.

Astrology is the study of motivation and drive. Interpretation depends on our ability to judge: "Observe, Remember, and Guess."

Mr. Corre commented that he would guess that most of the audience had a strong Saturn and Neptune.

A chart has too much information to make synthesis easy. Therefore, you must begin to view everything from the Natal Ascendant. The ASC is the life. The location of the Ascendant's ruler is important. In which house is it located and in which sign? For instance, if there is a Libra Ascendant, Venus rules. The sign Venus is in will tell a lot—Venus in Aries is very different from Venus in Pisces, as is Venus in Taurus in the 8th, compared to Venus in Capricorn in the 4th. Next, you look at the aspects to the Ascendant and then to its ruler. Planets in angular houses have more strength than those in succedent or cadent houses. Exaltations and debilities also carry much weight. The aspects used are conjunctions, oppositions, trines, squares and sextiles. Too many aspects to the Ascendant are difficult, as are no aspects to the Ascendant.

Repeat the foregoing with the MC, the I/C and the Descendant as well as all of the other house cusps, and you will get a feel for the chart and the person.

In each step, you must measure a planet's "quantity" by house position, and "quality" by zodiacal sign. Synthesis is important because it animates the chart. Analysis alone leaves the chart "lifeless."

Synthesis requires speed, which can only come with discipline: Good work habits, process, and methodology. We must train ourselves to prioritize, simplify and economize.

Quantity, or strength, comes through house position: 100% for angular house placements, 50% for succedent house placements, and 25% for cadent house placements.

Train yourself to see "3 as 1." If you can see the Ascendant and its ruler's house position and sign as one thing or unit, you have begun to grasp this method.

Mr. Corre led us through several charts utilizing the foregoing approach to familiarize us with the natal charts, in preparation for the Saturday workshop on transits.

Saturday Workshop: "On Transits: A Traditional Approach to Forecasting the Events of Life"

The natal chart determines what will ultimately occur. The transits are the timing trigger.

A transit is a timing method based on the relationship of the current sky to the natal chart. Interpretation of a planet's passage depends on the ability to understand its meaning within the context of the natal chart.

For instance, a common mistake is to interpret Jupiter as beneficial. Jupiter crossing the 10th house should mean major improvement. However, you must know its indication in the natal chart. Is Jupiter instrumental to the 10th house or its ruler? If not, the transit of Jupiter across the 10th house will not be significant.

An astrologer must be able to answer two questions: 1. What may I expect? This comes from the natal chart, and 2. When? This answer comes from forecasting techniques.

For instance, Jupiter’s current transit means something different to each of us.

Study the natal. Astrology is the study of motive and drive. How much of a drive is there (quantity)? The sharper the aspect, the greater the push. Angela Jolie has an exact square from Uranus in the 4th to the Asc. This aspect is tremendously powerful.

How you will achieve is shown by quality: dignities and debilities. Planets in domicile and exaltation are able to act in a moderate, refined way. Planets in detriment and fall tend to act in coarser ways; therefore they go to extremes.

Everything depends on the ASC, which is the person himself. Then look at the MC, which shows the destiny; then the Moon and finally the Sun. The Moon shows our instinctual drives, what we are hungry for. The Sun shows our ability to satisfy that hunger and to moderate those drives. A weak Sun and a strong Moon is a dangerous combination.

SIMPLE VS COMPLEX TRANSITS:

A transit is termed simple when you consider only its basic nature as it passes over a house cusp or through a house, or conjuncts or aspects another natal planet. A transit is complex when you consider not only the transiting planet’s nature but also observe its position and rulership in the natal chart.

QUESTION from audience: Saturn conjunct Moon? ANSWER from Mr. Corre: Depends on the sign.

Forecasting is a chain with four links:

- Natal
- Primary directions
- Returns
- Transits

Planets are indifferent. The houses determine the direction of activity.

The sky is perfect. Aspects in the sky are perfect.

Saturn square Mars in the sky is perfect. The houses show possible misuse.

When you know the ASC you have three things: Inclination, strength, quality.

Squares push for a showdown but squares in a chart can be mitigated by sextiles.

How “violent” are the squares? Look at Mars in the natal. If it is difficult, then all the squares can be judged as violent. If not, the squares may not be violent.

Houses can be divided into fortunate or unfortunate. Houses 2,6,8,12 are unfortunate because they are connected with values that go against the building up of life. The 7th is partnerships or open enemies.

- Every planet has a fear:
- Sun - loss of honor or dignity
 - Saturn - poverty
 - Mars- cowardice
 - Mercury - loss of understanding
 - Jupiter - loss of ethics

Venus in a masculine sign wants to touch; in a feminine sign wants to be touched. Saturn in masculine sign expects responsibility from others; in a feminine sign, will take on responsibility. Offense/defense: Mars in a feminine sign exhibits no danger if left alone; in a masculine sign it will pursue.

All of the foregoing and more need to be utilized to assess how strongly a transit will be felt. But you must be acquainted with the natal chart.

Dispositors are very important. A planet starts the action, the dispositor takes it over, and the final dispositor finishes the action.

Additionally, each natal planet can be both a significator and a promissor, adding to the complications for interpreting transits. And in addition to position and rulership, there is also the ricochet which can further complicate the situation. So we end with the beginning: observe, remember, guess!
