#### **FRIDAY NIGHT Lecture – “On the Fundamentals of Horoscope Interpretation”**

Tonight’s lecture is based on the tradition of Morin de Villefrance and teaches how to delineate a horoscope, starting with a solid understanding of the Ascendant, the horoscope’s pivotal component. By using a structured systematic approach, Morin’s techniques allow us to detect a person’s motivations and drives: those persons and things that strongly attract and push us in life. These skills give the astrologer the tools needed to answer two questions asked by every client: What may I expect during this lifetime and when may I expect it?

It is strongly recommended that you attend this session, as Saturday’s workshop on Transits depends on a basic understanding of the above tech-

niques. Please join us for what promises to be a novel and practical application that I am sure will complement your own studies and practice.

#### **SATURDAY Workshop – “On Transits: A Traditional Approach to Forecasting the Events of Life”**

This age-old, yet ever popular and reliable timing method is based on the relationship of the planets in the current sky to the natal chart. Robert’s talk will illustrate how interpretation of a planet’s passage depends on the ability to understand its meaning within the context of the natal chart.

Our workshop, based on Morin’s Book 24, “On Transits and Progressions” (which will be available at the book table) begins with an understanding of

two basic ideas; first, the need to be thoroughly acquainted with the natal chart, and second, that nothing can happen to a person which is not already foreseen in the natal. Transits, like all timing methods, only reveal when something existing already in potential may become a reality. This leads to a clarification of a very common misunderstanding many people have about prediction versus forecasting.

We will make use of horoscopes discussed during the Friday evening lecture to illustrate the impact of transits on the lives of those individuals during critical times in their life. Perhaps more than any other forecasting technique, transits dramatically illustrate to the astrologer how planets operate in a particular chart.

### Getting to Know Robert Corre

Robert Corre learned of Morin's approach to astrology when he encountered Zoltan Mason, a New York astrologer who used Morin's techniques. Robert was impressed enough with Mason to have a reading, and the reading's accuracy and detail convinced him to become Mason's pupil.

In 1995, Robert retired from a successful 25-year career in computing and information technology at New York University to become a professional astrologer. When Mason died in 2002, Robert took on the job of promoting Morin's teachings and has done so vigorously ever since. He teaches four classes weekly and publishes [ForumOnAstrology.com](http://ForumOnAstrology.com), a website that offers an online astrology course based on Morin's technique.

- a) "Collect and deposit all dues, registration fees, and/or gifts to the account of the Society, promptly recording all transactions to the official ledger.
- b) Process all disbursements, including co-signing checks for the disbursement of the Society's funds, subject to the Board's approval.
- c) Keep strict account, in writing, of all monies received and disbursed, retain written vouchers of all payments made, and present a monthly report of the current financial status, including income and disbursement, suitably itemized, at the monthly meetings.
- d) Monitor running expenditures against the approved budget on a monthly basis, and report the status at the monthly Board meetings.

The other very significant position is the Program Director, which has the following duties:

- a) "Select a slate of speakers, propose them, several months ahead of each meeting, to the Board, and negotiate fees, transport and accommodation arrangements within the guidelines agreed to by the Board.

- c) Coordinate the size of the meeting room with the Treasurer, and see that all materials (overhead projector, board, markers, etc.) needed by the speaker are available.

### ***Last month at the ASA ..... Joni Patry***

#### **WORLD PREDICTIONS FOR 2006**

Joni began by explaining the differences between Vedic and Tropical Astrology. Vedic takes into consideration the precession of the equinoxes. Hence, the 23° difference in planetary placement against the backdrop of the Sky. For instance, right now the Sun is in Aries, not in Taurus.

Either subtract 23° from your tropical placements or add 7° and subtract a sign. The aspects will remain the same.

Vedic can be very precise for predicting. Vedic uses whole signs and is lunar-based, unlike Tropical astrology, which is based on the Sun.

Ketu (the South Node) is knowing; and Rahu (the North Node) is thinking. Together, they are important considerations in Vedic prediction. Having the Nodes in angular houses is significant.

Each month, Joni runs a New Moon chart for Washington, DC and compares the aspects of the planets to both the President's Chart and the US chart. Of course, world events can be predicted as well, but since we live in the US, Joni concentrates on those two charts.

**Saturday Workshop, April 21, 2006****INTRODUCTION TO VEDIC ASTROLOGY**

Apply what you already know about the planets. The aspects that will be covered are the conjunctions, squares and oppositions. Sextiles and inconjuncts are used more in a relationship way. Derivative houses are used a lot in Vedic astrology. For instance, the 5th is the 3rd from the 3rd. The 11th house is the 6th from the 6th and can indicate the outcome of healing. Exaltations, debilities, etc., are also very important and used in tropical astrology as well.

In Vedic, Parashara is one of the main methods for prediction and the one Joni uses.

*Planetary Aspects/Drishti of Transits from Parashara.*

1. Full aspects are considered 100% in influence. There are weaker aspects that have effects of 75-50%;
2. Aspects are connectors of planetary and house energies;
3. Aspects are always counted in a forward direction;
4. Planets aspect houses even though no planet resides there;
5. Planets in the same sign/house are in aspect (conjunction);
6. Planets in opposite signs/houses are in aspect;
7. Mars' special aspects are 4 (7) and 8 signs/houses from its position;
8. Jupiter's special aspects are 5, (7) and 9 signs/houses from its position;
9. Saturn's special aspects are 3 (7) and 10 signs/houses from its position;
10. Rahu and Ketu's special aspects are 5 and 9 signs/houses from their position;
11. The aspects from the Moon give further clarification to the chart;
12. The transiting planets, aspecting the natal planet, trigger life events;
13. The transiting planet will carry the nature of its

placement in the natal chart. This involves its rulership of houses as well as the natal house it resides in and aspects it receive.

The ruling planet of the 11th house is a malefic in anyone's chart in Vedic astrology.

*Outline Transits for Prediction*

\*First look at where Jupiter and Saturn are transiting and where they are in relation to the Moon.

Also take into consideration the Navamsha of the chart/person. This is the 9th division of each house. If you have a wonderful chart but the Navamsha is not good, that is the final outcome. This explains the different strengths of aspects, which are not easily ascertained in tropical astrology unless you are using exaltations and debilities, which are always used in Vedic as well.

Dashas also have an important function in Vedic predictions and in determining the strengths of aspects.

Additionally, look for:

1. The house that the transiting planet is currently moving through and the houses it will move through in the future.
2. The aspects a transiting planet may form to the natal planets.
3. The houses ruled by the natal planet that is being aspected by transit.
4. The spatial relationship of transiting planets to the natal planets.
5. The dispositor of the natal planet being activated by the transiting planet will reveal the reason for the event that occurs.
6. The transiting planets can become stronger or weaker according to what sign or house they are in.
7. Jupiter and Saturn will give the main events of the year.\*
8. The signs/houses in which a faster-moving planet (Mercury, Venus, Mars) remains during the retrograde process will become prominent.
9. The transiting outer planets (Uranus, Neptune,

Pluto) will cause life-changing events when conjuncting or opposing a natal personal planet.

10. The Moon will be the timer of the exact day an event occurs when other transits are indicating a big event.

11. Rahu/Ketu are where most changes will occur for the next 1½ years. Note signs/houses they activate by opposition.

12. Watch the degrees of eclipses to see if they fall on a natal point in the birth chart, and to note the activation of that sensitive point when a transiting planet crosses over it later. It is like a “landmine.”

### Factors Activated During Planetary Dashes

Dashes contain 23 degrees and 40 minutes and are important considerations in determining any outcome. Dashes are based on where your natal Moon is in your chart. There are 27 nakshatras from 0° Aries to 27° Pisces.

Maha Dasha – Grand Cycle: Rahu, Ketu, and 7 planets = 9 cycles. Each nakshatra is ruled by a planet. 13° 20' = 27 of them — each has a rulership to a planet.

Nakshatras follow in order: Ketu, Venus, Sun, Moon, Mars, Rahu, Jupiter, Saturn, Mercury, Venus = 20-year cycles. Additionally, there are subcycles in the same order.

On September 11, 2001, the transiting Moon conjuncted Ketu. Where the Nodes are will signify the most changes.

### You must assess:

1. General: Natural Quality: Malefic or benefic
2. Special quality a planet takes on depending on the house the planet rules in the natal chart: functional benefic/functional malefic
3. Karaka: Each planet is the indicator (karaka) for certain things in life generally. These are called stirra (fixed) karakas, meaning they represent the same things for everyone. The planetary karakas are: Sun – Father; Moon – Mother; Mercury – aunts/uncles; Mars – brother; Venus – relationships

and fixed assets; Jupiter – children and wealth; Saturn – death and old age.

4. House placement will be the predominant area of life in focus throughout that period of time.

5. The Houses the maha dasha ruler become the areas concerned.

6. Yogas: If the maha dasha ruler is involved in a yoga, the yoga will be activated.

7. If a planet conjuncts the dasha ruler, that planet becomes activated along with its house rulers.

8. The houses the maha dasha ruler aspects will also become activated in this dasha period.

9. Whether a planet is exalted or debilitated will strengthen the effects for good or bad.

10. Divisional charts: check out where the planet appears in these charts. The Navamsha is imperative as to the outcome of the dasha. If the planet is in the same sign in the navamsha as in the natal chart (rashi), it has more strength. This is vargottame. If a planet is debilitated in the natal chart but exalted in the navamsha, it reverses the outcome for good, likewise, if it is exalted in the birth chart, but debilitated in the navamsha, it reverses the outcome for bad.

11. Dispositor: To find deeper meanings and reasons why the dasha is producing its effects, look to the dispositor of the planetary ruler.

12. Papa kartari/Shubba kartari: A dasha ruler that is between two malefic planets (papa kartari) either in the same house or flanked by the preceding and succeeding houses will be harmed and cannot operate to its fullest capacity. Likewise, if a dasha ruler is sandwiched between two benefic planets (shubba kartari) it will be given great opportunity to produce its most beneficial results.

13. Friend or Enemy sign placement.

Derivative houses are important indications of individuals in a chart for major events. For instance, the 1st house is the 3rd from the 11th house. This is the younger sibling to the eldest sibling. The next eldest in the birth order if one has older siblings. It is the 6th from the 8th house and the 8th from the 6th.

The 1st house has always meant injury to the physical body when difficult planets are placed here.

The 6th house is accidents, and the 8th house can indicate death. It can also indicate how healthy our physical body is and our constitution.

The 2nd house is the 4th from the 7th house. This house indicates death of the spouse or death of the marriage—divorce. Indications of this house are humiliations, disgrace or betrayal from the spouse.

The 3rd house is the 8th from the 8th house. This is another prominent house for death. It is the 12th from the 4th house. It is the endings or death of the parents; it is the house of the death of the mother, and so on. The 2nd to any house presents gains.

In Vedic astrology, spatial relationships are utilized like aspects in tropical, counting from one house to the other. For instance,

1/1 = the conjuncton

2/12 = gains and losses

3/11 = upa chia = sextile = opportunity

4/10 = square = events

5/9 = trines = ease

6/8 = inconjunct = accidents/health/problems/8th house = death/transformation. The most prevalent.

7/7 = opposition (7 signs from each other)

Yods are an important factor in the natal chart, and can be formed by transiting planets as well.

The midpoint between the two planets that are three signs away from each other is in opposition to the action point. It is called the REACTION POINT INDICATING THE CAUSE.

### **Other rules to be watched in predicting events.**

1. The orb of the transiting planet to the natal planet is very important. Look for the exact degree or a 3° orb as the most powerful.
2. Major life-altering events will occur when there are many aspects occurring at the same time.
3. All planets have 75% of their full strength in the 4th and 8th places from them.
4. A planet placed 10th from any house or planet influences the house. Exactly how it affects the house depends on the benefic or malefic nature of the planet.
5. Watch the transiting lunar nodes, Rahu and Ketu, if the midpoint conjoins a natal planet. This will produce an event. This planet will be 90° from each node or 4/10 relationship. This forms a T-square.

Do not forget when making predictions that the lunar nodes, Rahu/Ketu, are what produce eclipses; therefore, they are always involved in major changes in one's life. The houses that the nodes are in will be where the most change occurs.
